

A Kiss Upon the Cheek of the Christ Child?

Here we are in the week after the Epiphany of Our Lord, and my thoughts are still wrapped up in the adventure that the Magi made into the unknown and the homage they gave to the Christ Child. The Magi were religious pilgrims who sought a deeper understanding of the mysteries of life. They were specialists is reading the heavens; they had discovered an exceptional star and they knew it heralded something spectacular. With a combination of curiosity, yearning of heart, and a conviction that there was more to life than they already knew, they were compelled to pack their most valuable gifts and venture in to the unknown, ready to welcome whatever they might find.

Did you know that Matthew is the only evangelist to mention the Magi?

After encounters with one of the world's greatest despots, and with priests and scribes, the Magi's journey led them to Bethlehem where they discovered the child and his mother. There they did what they had set out to do: They gave homage to someone about whom they knew nothing except that his star enticed them.

Homage. What is homage?

Matthew uses the word "homage" three times in the short story about the Magi. The Greek word Matthew used has a variety of meanings including to bow down, to prostrate oneself, to kneel before another and even to kiss. We easily picture them bowing or kneeling, but did you ever imagine the Magi kissing the baby? After all, it's a normal response to seeing a little child and a gentle, loving sign of acceptance and willingness to protect. Finally, to demonstrate their homage, the Magi presented their gifts. They returned home "another way," changed people who had humbly recognized what others refused to see.

Truly, have you ever imagined the Magi kissing Baby Jesus?!

The pilgrim Magi remind us that we too are invited to be humble enough to see something new. At the beginning of this new year 2025, I invite you to reread the narrative of Matthew 2:1-12. May the Magi help us realize that there is always more to discover in God's mysteries. May they suggest to our hearts that the willingness to venture into the unknown might even lead to the opportunity to kiss the face of God.

May this new year give you open eyes with which to see the Mysteries that are our God.


